Scientists said that intensifying rainfall, driven by climate change, could increase the risk of landslides in the area of Southeast Alaska that includes Ketchikan." Local Resources

Ketchikan Gateway Borough

The Ketchikan Gateway Borough has issued a local <u>declaration of disaster emergency</u> following the August 25, 2024, Third Avenue Bypass Landslide. Multiple homes have been impacted and the vicinity has been evacuated due to the potential for secondary landslides.

- An emergency shelter has been set up at the Ketchikan High School. The shelter is fully stocked with supplies, bedding, food, and necessities, and there is ample capacity available. The Gateway Recreation Center has showers and towels available from 5:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.
- Evacuees who need to enter their homes should notify the Ketchikan Emergency Operations Center at 907-228-2383 prior to accessing the area.
- Emergency crews and Public Works crews are onsite. Dawson Construction has been mobilized to assist with clearing roadways. The power lines have been cleared and grounded. Power service to the area is expected to be out for an extended period.

- The division's State Individual Assistance and Temporary Housing programs are accepting applications from survivors with damages or emergency expenses related to the landslide. Please collect property ownership documents, insurance policies, and proof of residency, and take pictures of damages.
